## **AROUND THE STATION**

#### **CBAA Conference**

The Community Broadcasting Association of Australia (CBAA) Annual Conference was held in Adelaide in November.

TYGA FM has recently been successful in our application for a technical equipment grant of just under \$7,500.

We'll be getting a new signal processor, a dead-air detector with automated emergency audio, and a solar emergency power backup.

This will be installed in the New Year by the TYGA Tech Team.

#### TYGA FM Annual General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting of Derwent Valley Community Radio Association Inc. will be held on Thursday 18 December 2014 at 6.00 pm in the Derwent Valley Social Rooms, Circle Street, New Norfolk.

All members of the Association may attend the meeting, but only members aged 18 or over may vote in the election of office bearers or stand for election.

Nominations for election as office bearers must be in writing, signed by 2 members of the association and be accompanied by the candidate's written consent. Nominations must be received by the Secretary at least 5 working days before the meeting.


## TYGA FM TRIVIA NIGHT

# WOMEN IN COMMUNITY MEDIA PROJECT

Earlier in 2014 the Community Media Training Organisation (CMTO) invited women involved in community radio, in any capacity, to apply for its new Women In Community Media program.

Three TYGA presenters were successful in getting a place on the program: Colleen (presenter of Colleen's Favourites), Zoe (The Wild Child) and Barb (Dolly Ringwald of Octogenarius).

The program ran during the second half of 2014. The participants managed a small women-related project at their stations, attended monthly webinars and had meetings with an experienced mentor to learn more about the community media sector.

Zoe was a teenage mum, and knows how isolating this can be, especially for people without good support networks. Her idea was to help bring young mums together, give them an opportunity to meet other people and have some fun. She organised a line dancing night, which was all about "getting in line and having a good time".

Zoe says she strongly believes that dancing, music and talking with other people is food for the soul and a great stress release – and she wants to share that with anyone she can.

The line dancing classes will be on Fridays beginning on 12 December at 6.00 pm at St Matthew's Church Hall, Bathurst St, New Norfolk. The cost is just \$5 per class and any women (not just young mums) who want to come along are welcome.

Barb and Colleen worked together on a project to teach female presenters some vocal skills and techniques that would help them feel more confident speaking on air.

Barb explains, "Talking to the other program participants, we learned that a reason some women don't want to go on air is that they don't like how they sound

and don't feel confident speaking in a public space. So we wanted to explore techniques to help our female presenters use their voices more effectively."

Barb and Colleen arranged a half-day training session for a small group of presenters. This was with a professional vocal coach, who showed them basic skills about posture, breathing and voice control.

The second part of the day was an informal discussion about being on the radio with some radio presenters, including Louise Saunders from ABC Hobart, who started her media career in community radio.



Barb, Colleen and Zoe presented their projects at the CBAA conference in November. They also met the other participants in the program, who until then, they had only known online.

They've all returned from the conference with a better understanding of the community radio sector and with some great ideas to take their projects further.

## **PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT**

#### Colleen's Favourites

TYGA FM provides a wide variety of programs covering almost all musical tastes and each issue of TYGAbytes will spotlight a different show.

This time it's Colleen's Favourites, with Colleen Monk, which is broadcast on Tuesdays from 9.00 am to 12.00. The show provides a mixture of country, 60s and 80s, as well as some new music.

Colleen has been with TYGA FM for two years, and TYGA is her first experience with community radio. She says that when she was young, she imagined herself as a DJ, and would spend hours pretending to read the news and announce.

Colleen joined TYGA FM because she wanted to share her music with our small community. She loves how the community is involved with the radio station and the personal connections the station makes with our listeners.

One of Colleen's favourite things about TYGA is the annual trivia night, which gives our listeners a chance to meet our presenters and for everyone to get together to have a fun night. She sees this as a great example of community spirit.

Colleen says that music has been her passion for as long as she can remember

She spent her teenage years (and money) going to every concert she could. Living in Sydney, she says this wasn't hard to do.

Colleen told TYGABytes that she slept overnight in a sleeping bag at Sydney Airport the night before the Beatles arrived in Sydney. "I was there to experience the bedlam when the four lads from Liverpool arrived," she says.

Some of the more memorable artists she's seen live have included Rod Stewart, Neil Diamond, Roy Orbison and Meatloaf.

Colleen has even been kissed on the cheek at the Royal Sydney Easter Show by Johnny Young and Normie Rowe!
